

PAINTERS' LANDING



The District of West Vancouver (District) is inviting up to twelve artists to work, exhibit and sell their art on the east side of Millennium Park.

Designed as an off-site program giving opportunity for artists to create art in public spaces, not as a retail venue. Sales are welcome as you create.

DATES: April, May, June, July, August, September, October
Monday to Sunday, 9 a.m. – 9 p.m.

FEE: \$315 for season + GST – pay for the entire season and save
\$55 per month + GST – choose your months and pay as you go.

COVID-19 Safety Plan: Applications must include a safety plan demonstrating how you will maintain physical distancing at all times, what cleaning regimes will be in place and that all artist participants use the COVID-19 self-assessment tool found at <https://bc.thrive.health/>.

LOCATION: Millennium Park (15th Street and Argyle Avenue) east of 15th Street. Due to renovations of the Ferry Building, the Ferry Building Landing is not available for the 2021 season. (There will be an alternate location between July 26 and August 13 during Harmony Arts.)

HOW TO APPLY FOR A PERMIT

- 1) Application form
- 2) COVID-19 Safety Plan
- 3) Three (3) photographs or images of work for approval. (Images will become the property of the District)

NOTE: Occasionally weddings and other activities receive permits for the grass spaces approved for Painters' Landing. We will send out an email notifying you of the dates and times. There will be no extension of permits for the days that are unavailable for your use.

PAINTERS' LANDING

QUALIFICATIONS:

- An artist must be 19 years of age OR, if under 19, an adult responsible for the artist must purchase the permit.
- Artists must have Canadian work permits (SIN) and be a resident of BC.

DISPLAY OF ART WORK

All work must be original, not reproductions, by the artist assigned to the permit.

Permitted work includes:

- 2-dimensional work: watercolour, oil, acrylic, pastel, charcoal, pencil, ink
**prints, spray paint, newsprint, crafts, and cards are not permitted*
- 3-D art (*sculpture only*)
- landscape artists, painters, printmakers, portraiture, photography
- photographers must provide model releases when applicable and may exhibit only one master print at one time
- printmakers may exhibit handmade limited edition prints produced by the artist from the original plate

EXHIBIT AREA

The intent of Painters' Landing is to exhibit and demonstrate the process of producing art. Spaces are on a first-come basis. Each artist is limited to a 12x12' space. Artists may display a card (maximum 10x10") with their name, address, phone, email and website.

Standard art easels or approved display stand are to be used to display work, no portable walls or booths. The top must not exceed 1.5m (5') in height. Pre-approval required for small tables. No art or equipment may be set-up on pavement. Please set up artwork at least 6 feet away from any walkway.

Staff may remove easels and equipment left unattended for a period of more than 30 minutes at any one time.

PARKING

Please observe all parking bylaws, including time limits. All day parking is available in Ambleside Park, one block east of Painters' Landing; the District does not issue or sell parking permits. Use loading zones to drop off art and supplies. Please do not cause congestion or disruption to traffic or pedestrians.

REGULATIONS RELATED TO ARTISTS' ACTIVITY

- Observe all Parks bylaws.
- Artists will be cordial and respectful of other artists and their work.
- Artists will not pressure the public to buy any work, matting or packaging. Artists will not enter another artist's area to pursue or solicit customers.
- Approved for use: Patio Umbrella (9') with stand that holds water or sand. Tents or canopies not approved.
- No animals, barbecues, electric or generated lighting, or amplified sound are allowed.

Artists that do not abide by regulations will receive a warning letter from the District. A second infraction will result in forfeiture of permit. The District reserves the right to revoke the artist's permit immediately if the artist's behavior is incompatible with these guidelines.
